

What is a School-Parent Compact?

A School-Parent Compact is a jointly developed agreement with parents. The compact outlines how parents, the entire school staff, and students will share the responsibility for improved student academic achievement and how they will work together as partners to make sure all students reach grade-level standards.

Effective compacts:

- Link to goals of the School Improvement Plan
- Focus on student learning skills
- Describe how teachers will help students develop skills using high-quality instruction
- Share strategies that parents can do at home
- Explain how teachers and parents will communicate about student progress
- Describe opportunities for parents to volunteer, observe, and participate in the classroom

Jointly Developed

Together, the parents, students and staff of Moreland Road Elementary developed this School-Parent Compact for achievement. Teachers suggested home learning strategies, parents added ideas to make them more specific, and students told us what would help them learn. Meetings are held each year in the spring to review the compact and make changes based on student needs and school improvement goals. Parents are encouraged to attend and are welcome to contribute comments or suggestions at any time. Parents are also encouraged to participate in the annual Title I parent survey that is used as a tool to collect parent feedback regarding current Title I programs and policies.

School Responsibilities:

As a School:

- Ask student reading comprehension questions targeted to their FNP level.
- Utilize academic resources and websites during instruction time to help with reading and share them with parents to use at home
- Work with child to develop an understanding and fluency with multiplication and division to 100

Family Responsibilities:

As a Family Member:

- Ask my child reading comprehension questions provided by the teacher
- Utilize the academic resources and websites to help my child with reading

Our Goals for Student Achievement

District Goals

- Increase the percentage of students scoring proficient learner or distinguished learner in English language arts (ELA), math, science, and social studies by 5% as measured by the 2022 College and Career Ready Performance Index (CCRPI) content mastery district score for each level (elementary, middle and high)
- Increase the average school climate rating by 3% as measured by the average of the 2022 School Climate Star Rating

School Goal & Focus Goal

- Increase the percentage of K-5 students reading and math at or above the grade on the grade level norm RIT based on the Measure of Academic Progress (MAP) by 3 percentage points
- Increase the percentage of 3rd - 5th grade students performing at proficient and distinguished levels in English language arts on the Georgia Milestones by 5 percentage points
- Move from an emerging PBIS school to a distinguished PBIS school through the improvement of culture and climate among students and staff.
